<u>T&E</u> – Threatened and Endangered At the end of February, with the exception of the Wood Supply Assessment modeling scenarios, all WFPS projects where complete. At the March 29th COF meeting the principle investigators for each project presented their respective methods and findings. Their presentations, project reports, and other information about the WFPS can be found at http://study.wisconsinforestry.org.

At the March Council meeting a process was proposed and adopted to establish Sub-Committees to review the various projects to provide recommendations and to identify any additional information needs to the Council for their consideration to help guide decisions and policy development for investment in forest-based manufacturing industries in Wisconsin, while ensuring that social and ecological benefits provided by Wisconsin's forest remain viable for future generations.

The Sub-Committees were appointed by Henry Schienebeck and Jane Severt and include 21 members from a variety of organizations interested in the economic, social and ecologic value forests provide to Wisconsin. The three Sub-Committee are supported by two facilitators and personnel within WDNR.

The Economic /Ecological Effects of Forest practices and Harvesting Restrictions Sub-Committee and Single Tree Order-of-Removal (OOR) in Northern Hardwood Forest and Rotation Lengths in Red Pine and Aspen Forests Sub-Committee have each meet twice. They are in the final stages of preparing their recommendations. The Wood Supply Analysis Sub-Committee will have its first meeting on July 28th.

In late August the Sub-Committees will meet as a group to finalize their recommendations to present to the COF at their September meeting.
