

**WHAT:**

The *Wisconsin Forestry Practices Study (WFPS)* was a comprehensive study of Wisconsin forestry practices. Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association (GLTPA) and Wisconsin County Forests Association (WCFA) received a state grant from the legislature in 2013 for \$600,000 to complete the study. GLTPA and WCFA used a consultative process with the Wisconsin Council on Forestry to guide the research and resulting recommendations developed in 2018.

**GOAL:**

Provide information to better understand where efficiencies can be gained to ensure Wisconsin’s forest products industry can remain competitive and vibrant, while assuring the ecological, economic and social benefits of Wisconsin forests continue for future generations.
