Hittle Rebecca Diebel, DNR Policy Advisor, explained to the Council the purpose of the biennial report, the information included within it, and what items could be revised to make the report more meaningful. Tom Hittle, Council Chair, led a discussion on the amount of data versus recommendations in the report, how the report is used by different audiences, and the role of the Council in creating the report itself. State Budget: Forestry received supplemental funding for Forest Fire Protection and County Forest Administrator/Sustainable Forestry grants; as

well as bonded funding for repairs needed at several ranger stations throughout the state.

- <u>Bat HCP</u>: Chapter 4 (*Take Estimate*) is being updated with post-WNS bat populations and states will review the numbers shortly. The Fish & Wildlife Service submitted comments on Chapter 5 (*Conservation Plan*) and the Steering Committee is working to find mutually agreed upon solutions. When complete, both Chapters 4 and 5 will be released for public comment. Chapter 6 (*Implementation*) should be ready for DNR review later this summer.
- <u>Forest Health Publications</u>: The HRD Preventative Treatment Guidelines are available on the DNR page and the EAB Silviculture Guidelines should be done by late summer.
- **Biochar Webinar**: The webinar is scheduled for 8/21/19 additional updates will be delivered via the Council's GovDelivery.
- NRB approved the final draft on 6/26/19. After approval by the Governor, it will be reviewed by the Legislature. The rule should be published in January 2020.
- <u>Forest Action Plan</u>: Forestry is in the process of drafting the first section of the plan, the assessment, and will be sharing it for a 21-day public review in late summer. In October, Forestry will start to hold workshops for partner groups to develop the strategy portion of the plan and hopefully will have a first draft ready by winter.
- GNA Farm Bill 2018 changes: The Forest Service and Office of the General Council provided their interpretation of the bill see the USDA GNA Farm Bill Changes document on the Council's webpage for details. The information in the document is preliminary and subject to change until the final policy in place. The USDA Forest Service Handbook describing GNA implementation is being drafted with a targeted completion of fall 2019.
- 7/20/19 Storm Damage: Langlade, Oconto, and Waupaca counties were the hardest hit, but the storm caused a variety of damage over large parts of the state. There are numerous requests for chainsaw crews to assist with cleanup and Forestry is prioritizing the requests and dispatching crews to assist with the most urgent issues first. Staff are working on assessing the situation and documenting the extent of the storm damage.
