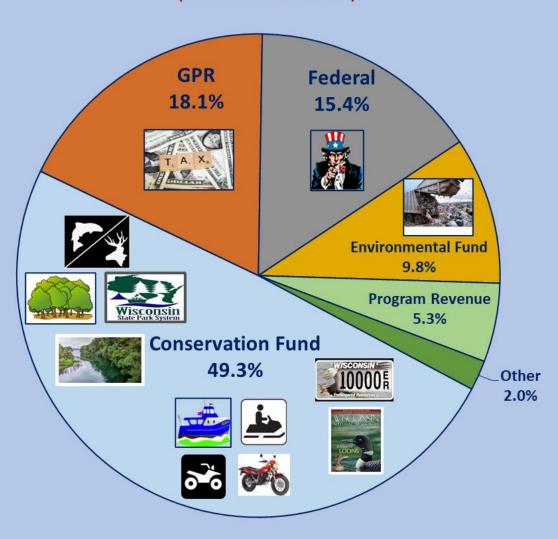

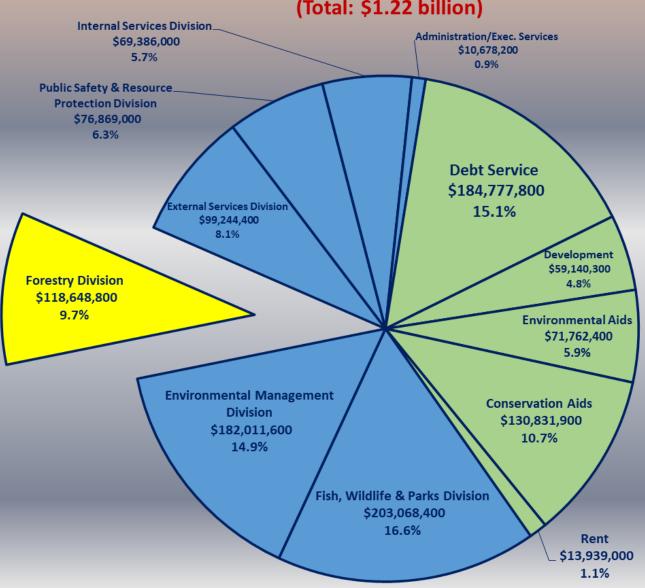
2023-25 Biennial Budget, Funding Source Distribution (Total: \$1.22 billion)

Department-wide Funding

- DNR's two-year budget increases by \$85.5 million, or 7.5% over base.
 - By comparison, the 2021-23 budget ended up at 0.1% below the base.

Department-wide Budget Cuts

 Across-the-board salary line reduction: \$2.6 m/yr.

 Supply line reductions for Forestry, Internal Services and External Services Divisions: \$1.8 m/yr.

Department-wide Position Changes

No new positions approved

- Net reduction of 51.71 positions, comprised of:
 - Long-term vacancy cuts
 - Expiring project positions

PFAS

\$125 million PFAS Trust
 Fund established

Access to funding is yet to be determined

Parks System Operations

Over \$1.3 million to cover:

- Maintenance equipment upgrades
- Visitor payment and counting technology (e.g., kiosks, credit card terminals, etc.) upgrades
- Higher utility costs

Campsite electrification cap eliminated (had previously been capped at 35%)

Maintenance & Repair Backlog

 \$30.6 million for maintenance, repair and upgrades to parks, roads, buildings, bridges, parking lots, boat ramps, campsites, etc.

 \$26.6 million+ of previously unused Stewardship bonding for property development projects (via Gov's partial veto)

Fish & Wildlife Account Revenue Enhancers

\$25 million <u>one-time</u>
 transfer from the Forestry
 Account

 Nonresident hunting and fishing license fee increases: est. \$2.2 million/yr.

Staff Safety Equipment

Over \$1.9 million designated for:

- Forestry fire suppression equipment & AEDs
- Warden AEDs & Taser units
- Warden off-road vehicle fleet replacement
- Repairs/upgrades to
 Fisheries' research vessels

Grants & Local Assistance

Forestry-Related

- Urban Forestry Grants: \$350,000
- County Forest Grants: \$500,000

Environmental

- Great Lakes contaminated sediment removal: \$7.5 million
- Ag-Related Nonpoint Source Pollution: \$6.5 million
- Urban Nonpoint Source Pollution/Flood Control: \$4.0 million

<u>Other</u>

- Rec Vehicle (ATV/UTV & Snowmobile) Aids: \$3.1 million
- Dam Repair, Replacement & Removal: \$4.0 million
- Earmarks (dams, dredging, etc): \$5.0 million

Forestry Items Not Approved

- Terrestrial Invasive Species Prevention: \$1.2 million
- Tree Planting on State-Owned Lands: \$790,000
- Nursery Operations: \$627,800
- Public Forest Regeneration Grants: \$1.3 million
- Wisconsin Forest Landowner Grants: \$620,000
- Forest Industrywide Strategic Roadmap: \$775,000
- Open the Outdoors Recreation Access: \$300,000
- County Forest Wildlife Habitat Grants: \$256,600
- Forestry Education/Career Outreach: \$195,000
- Stewardship Forestry Account Lapse Correction: statutory language proposal
