Coalition and Applicant: Stacey Johnson & Paul Fowler

Led by the WPC, a diverse and powerful coalition was formed to represent the voice of Wisconsin's Forest Products Industry. This coalition includes WPC, GLTPA, SRI, Mid State Technical College, UW-Stevens Point, Menominee Nation Tribal Enterprises, and the Wisconsin DNR.

Phase 1: \$500,000 Technical Assistance Grant (50-60 recipients from 536 applications)

- Application submitted
- Achieved support of National philanthropic group and consultants for Phase 2 development
- Announcement anticipated December 8th

Phase 2: \$98-Million grant to complete Phase 2 proposal (estimated to be 30 recipients)

- Work is actively underway
- 7 independent projects included in 1 transformational proposal

This proposal has received dozens of letters of support and partnership from industry, unions, CoF, educational institutions from k-12 to university, EDC's and non-profits, trade organizations, local and state officials, WEDC, Governor Evers and Senator Baldwin.

WPC Workforce Study, Awards & Special Projects

- WPC/UW-Oshkosh Statewide Workforce Study: Final Stage
 - ▶ Outreach, data collection, and stakeholder meetings are complete. The final report is being completed this quarter, anticipating scheduling a public event to share the results.
- Converting Study Grant (\$25,000) Awarded
 - WPC was awarded \$25,000 to study the state of WI's converting industry and the use of Wi materials in converting. This project is a partnership effort between WPC and Scott Bowe, Kemp Research Center
 - ► Current efforts includes: interviews, tours, and data collection is underway
 - ► This project is supported by UWSP, DNR, multiple WPC members and industry partners
- Workforce Innovation Grant (\$9-mil, \$35,000) Applied in Partnership
 - ► The WEDC announced \$100 million grant to support Regional efforts to address workforce issues in WI. Nearly 140 applications have been received
 - WPC partnered with Mid-State Technical College and the Centergy region on this opportunity and applied for funds to develop and implement programming specific to the forest products industry
