History


- Partnership of federal public lands management with federal private & Tribal land management assistance
- Projects include both US Forest Service landbase and surrounding private & Tribal lands
- Large enough project area to make a large-scale conservation difference
- Address wildfire, water quality, wildlife habitat, climate change, forest health
- Projects started in 2014
- Projects have 3 years of funding
- 41 projects total since beginning of program
- 2023 14 new projects funded, \$48 million USDA investment

Wisconsin History

- One project from 2014 2017 in Lake Superior basin
- Lake Superior Landscape Restoration Partnership
- Over two dozen entities in partnership
- Goals Reduce sediment and manure in waterways, wildlife habitat, brook trout habitat, forest fuels reduction
- ~2,700 acres of treatment, 48 miles of stream work in 189 projects
- Facilitated re-introduction of sharp-tailed grouse, created golden-winged warbler & Kirtlands warbler habitat
- \$1.5 million invested in NRCS projects








- Focus of project
 - Blowdown from 2019 & 2022 storms
 - Water quality focused on brook trout habitat
 - Wildlife habitat for golden-winged warbler & monarch butterfly
 - Sustainable forest management in general

- Private and Tribal Lands
 - Administered through NRCS as an EQIP fund pool
 - \$1.5 million over three-year period
 - Funding determined each year, not guaranteed







- US Forest Service Lands
 - ~\$1 million over three-year period
 - Funding determined each year, not guaranteed
 - Projects include culvert replacement, oak wilt treatment, fuel reduction, and planting non-ash species in ash wetlands
