The team will present their findings at the November Council Meeting.
9:00 AM Forest Exploration Center Update (Fred Souba)		Fred explained the location for the FEC was chosen because many citizens in that portion of the state do not understand the value of forestry for the state of Wisconsin. The property is 68 acres surrounded by development. It will provide many opportunities for surrounding schools and community programs to learn about Wisconsin forests. Fred mentioned that it will not be utilized as a working forest but an education center. Department of Transportation will assist with site prep in 2018. Many council members expressed concern that if the parcel does not have active logging it will not represent timber management and forestry as a whole. Fred clarified that some management may take place as needed. Members also expressed that more forestry representatives should be on the FEC Board to help provide perspective during the planning stages.	Motion made (Jane) that the Council draft a letter to the board of FEC to provide assistance as they develop plans. Mark Rickenbach added that the Council invite the board to a Council meeting to provide an overview of their long-term goals for the FEC. Some disputes are related to water regulations, which may account for why Steigerwaldt has not been contacted.
