Background

- In early 2011, Wisconsin's Council on Forestry (COF) identified five priority issues:
 - Timber supply
 - Forest certification
 - Wisconsin's Managed Forest Law (MFL) Program
 - Deer
 - Education
- The 2013 Wisconsin's Forestry Practices Study is a comprehensive study of DNR forestry and forest fire prevention practices. Research projects will provide new or enhance existing information to provide guidance in addressing these and other forest policy issues.





Background – Cont'd

- The Goal
 - Obtain research results to guide decisions and policy development for investment in forest-based manufacturing in Wisconsin while;
 - Ensuring the social and ecological benefits of forests remain viable for future generations.
- Funding is in the form of a \$600,000 Grant from the State over a two-year period.
- Grant Recipients Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association (GLTPA) and Wisconsin County Forests Association (WCFA).
- GLTPA and WCFA have selected the National Council for Air and Stream Improvement (NCASI) to serve as general contractor for this Study.
 - NCASI is an independent, non-profit 501(c)(6) research institute formed in 1943 focusing on environmental and sustainability topics relevant to forest management and the manufacture of forest products.
